A. Lincoln and Me

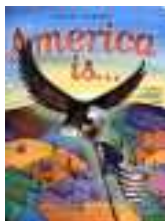
A young boy realizes he not only shares his birthday and similar physical appearance with Abraham Lincoln, but he is like him in other ways as well. *Ages 4-8.*

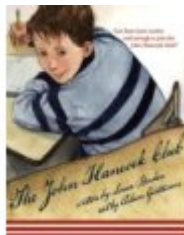


Fly High!: The Story of Bessie Coleman

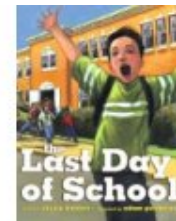
The John Hancock Club
