

Non-Prescription Over-the-Counter (OTC) Medications

1. The ONLY non-prescription medications/OTC medications that will be administered during extended field trips are as follows: Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), Calcium Carbonate (Tums), Diphenhydramine tablets (Benadryl), Diphenhydramine gel/spray (Anti-itch), Cough Drops/Throat Lozenges.
2. An Authorization for Administration of Non-Prescription Over-the-Counter (OTC) Medication Form is available in the school office.
3. OTC medications as listed above are provided and maintained by the school health staff in the school's clinic in the original containers with the manufacturer's label.
4. Notify the school nurse immediately of any medication changes or if your child develops an allergy to the medication, including any decision to withdraw your consent to administer these drugs.
5. Any nonprescription medication that is to be given for more than three (3) consecutive school days must be authorized in writing by a physician.
6. OTC medications shall only be administered in accordance with package labeling or as instructed by a prescriber.

PARENTAL PERMISSION

- I request the designated school personnel (school nurse) to assist my child in the administration of the above described medication/s. I give permission for my child to take the medication indicated above by my checking the yes box according to the conditions/symptoms described while on extended field trips away from the school site. I understand that this is not permission for the school to administer non-prescribed, OTC medications at school during regular school hours.
- I understand that there is no liability on the part of the school district or its personnel for civil damages as a result of the administration of this medication to my child when the person administering the medication acts as an ordinary reasonably prudent person would have acted under the same or similar circumstances.
- Only the OTC medications listed above will be stocked in the clinic to be provided on extended field trips as necessary. All medications listed above are in capsule or tablet form; thus, if my child needs chewable tablets or liquid medications, I understand that it is my responsibility to supply that medication.
- I will be contacted if my child's symptoms do not improve and she/he is unable to remain at the location of any extended field trip.
