DISTRICT

The Mariemont City School District serves over 1,700 students in a suburb east of Cincinnati. The community includes a cross section of all socioeconomic levels, and attained educational levels with the priority of educating our students and preparing them for post-secondary education. Our district focuses on a strong academic program while encouraging experiential learning for students through innovative master classes and a four-day intersession. Students are supported as they research their individual interests. Disciplinary matters are internal school issues. Our policy is to exclude commentary on school discipline matters.

Mariemont High School has been named a **Blue Ribbon School** four times. 87% of our students participate in our 60 clubs/activities. MHS complies with the NACAC'S Code of Ethics and Professional Practices. The academic year is two traditional semesters with seven 50-minute class periods beginning at 8:30 a.m. and ending at 3:30 p.m.

COVID-19 Adaptations

Fourth quarter of the 2019-20 school year was taught remotely, and our teachers used zoom to meet with students regularly. Letter grades were assigned.

The 2020-21 school year will include a hybrid learning model including an equal mix of in-person days and virtual learning days as well as having all students present. This schedule is fluid depending on the current COVID-19 conditions. In addition, students were provided with the option of attending school via the online format 100% of the time. Approximately 10% of our students chose the online format.
